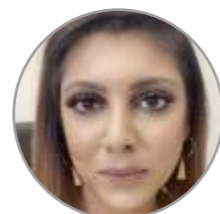

## STAFF BULLETIN

### A ROBUST YOUTH MAKES A STRONG NATION

Singapore has rolled out a national movement to train and prepare all the residents to respond to unforeseen circumstances like terrorism threats.

Understanding the need of the hour, Amity Global Institute Singapore collaborated with Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) to carry out the community Emergency Preparedness Programme (CEPP) for the students as part of their holistic development.

Through the CEPP programme, SCDF officers provided live demonstrations of the three crucial aspects of lifesaving skills and emergency procedures: first aid, Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and Fire Safety.

Amity students were also in action for the practical hands-on engagements to understand better the knowledge acquired and apply what they have learned practically to help others during emergencies.

#### Wound Management

Students took turns to role-play an injured person to practice wound management in the event of severe bleeding by tightening the bandage with a pen to apply pressure and stop the bleeding.



#### CPR

Students practise the correct posture while guided by an AED machine to administer CPR compressions on an injured person.



#### Fire Safety

Students learnt to unpin and operate a fire extinguisher and had to put out a simulated kitchen stove fire.



Together, we can build a community that is more aware of the seriousness of the terrorism threat, and everyone can do their part to learn the necessary skills and knowledge to keep Singapore a safe place to thrive.

## POWER OF VULNERABILITY

### Introduction

As a practicing professional teacher, I struggle with a deep sense of worthiness in supporting culturally and linguistically diverse groups of students in my school. This is because understanding the global dimensions of various disciplines of multicultural students for instructional design can never be standardized (Gay & Kirkland, 2003). This challenge reminds me of the power of vulnerability posited by Brene Brown, where a strong sense of worthiness is related to a strong sense of love and belonging. The hardest part for me is whether I am worthy of my student's connection. I do not know how my student see me, as I cannot read their minds. The questions are, what gets in the way if I become vulnerable to them? Moreover, how will my courage to open up to my students allow them to

reciprocate their willingness to offer me honest feedback? (TEDxHouston, 2010)

During the past two years, while teaching remotely, many of my learners have explored the knowledge, skill, and disposition I must have to teach and work with them collaboratively. However, many uncertainties like internet connection, students' learning environment, and other personal reasons made online learning a very challenging task. Some tasks is due to the activities required, like intense discussion and interactive discourse for building students' competencies in their course units. I felt a need for inadequacy in culturally responsive teaching where students might not have the ability to fully understand what is communicated online through their devices (Brisk, Barnhardt, Herrera, & Rochon, 2002).

### What gets in the way of being vulnerable?

We live in a technological culture where the term "vulnerability" can mean all types of destruction, death, and disintegration of humans, social networks, and technical systems (Bijker, 2009). On the other hand, we have seen that technological development has given society more excellent connectivity, and those who suffer are connected to the sufferers, like in the war between Russia and Ukraine. The news went viral through millions or billions of connections.

In the context of living and learning globally, as a professional teacher, I am used to instruct students on what they must do to pass and complete their course units. Therefore, the relationship could be highly transmission rather than value-adding. I need to engage my students with current developments through technology to add value to their studies and create new narratives of global unity (Bijker, 2009).

### How does vulnerability lead to resilience and intercultural understanding?

The occurrence of a phenomenon of a given magnitude and degree of susceptibility can be expressed in several terms. These terms could be the destruction, hazards, and suffering it brings to a person, group, or nation. Having the strength and courage to overcome this magnitude takes a deeper understanding of our risk and how this affects others (Buckle, 2000). Intercultural sensitivity and understanding take the form of accommodating to remove the shame of fear of disconnection so we can live, love, work, and instruct well (TEDxHouston, 2010).

### Conclusion

The power of vulnerability has been examined as our fear of disconnection and what gets in our way. To overcome this, we must take the courage to speak up wholeheartedly. Therefore, we can live, love, work and instruct our culturally diverse learners with a personalized approach. We become our authentic selves when we can say "I am enough," or we do not need to rationalize uncertainty with certainty. We must be who we are in the eyes of our students. We must practice kindness and gentleness with an attitude of the heart to accept and submit to imperfection (TEDxHouston, 2010).
